IX.	What Have We Done Well? With no employees, the scope of their role is limited.  Meetings are open to the public and an affordable intergovernmental agreement with the Montgomery County Tax assessor is in place.
X.	What Inefficiencies Did We Identify/What Are our Next Steps? This committee found that we had not identified who the FOIA, OMA and Whistleblower official should be. When we began, they certification had not

been completed but it has as of our final report. Whistleblower Ordinance was also found to be missing but is now completed and official.

XI. What Can We Do Better or More Efficiently? Ensure annual training is completed to make sure we are in compliance with state laws.

## XII. Studies on Governmental Efficiencies

In preparing this report, we reviewed several studies on local government efficiency. These studies show that:

- The average local government in Illinois serves 1800 residents compared to the national median of 2850 individuals
- Most townships in Illinois have no bonded indebtedness. Together with road districts they are an integral element of local democracy. Township expenditures have grown at a lower rate than those of any other level of government since 1992.
- Townships have lower labor costs and employ mostly part time employees.
