IDOR:

I delivered our final abstract to the state April 17th and we received our final multiplier of 1.0000 this past Friday. Per statute assessments need to be 33.33% of fair market value and now Montgomery County collectively is at 33.49%. This is a great improvement from where we were previously at 28% collectively for all townships.

Homestead Exemptions:

Our deadline for exemption renewals for senior and disability was May 1st; however, we will continue to accept them through the end of the year. Many SCAFHE renewals had to be mailed back as we are requiring proof of income to verify the financial figures per IDOR. In doing this we have found a lot of property owners that should not have qualified for this exemption and now the exemptions have been removed from their properties.

Field Work:

My office has been working diligently both in the field and in office collecting and inputting 2024 assessment data. All structures 200sf and larger regardless of foundation will be assessed for 2024 and subsequent years. I will be publishing in the paper requesting property owners to contact our office to let us know if they have a structure that needs to be assessed. This is a huge undertaking for my office as well as the other township assessors so the public's corporation would be greatly appreciated, however, we will be working hard to get these structures assessed regardless by use of our current flyover data, word of mouth, and going out in person to every parcel within the county.

SB3275:

Discussed in great length at the Area IV meeting I attended last month, would require all Real Estate Transfer Declarations to be electronic (MyDec), this passed the Senate in March 58-1. I have been following this Bill as it would greatly speed up our processing of RETDs in my office. The 24th of April it was assigned to the House Revenue and Finance Committee. This Bill would also alleviate a lot of time and work in the Recorder's Office and I do believe Sandy is tracking this Bill as well.

Wind and Solar Farms:

With both wind and solar farms coming to the county I am concerned with how this will affect the drainage districts and how the amount owed is calculated within my office. I have been in contact with IDOR, Drainage District Commissioner Dick Lyons, board member Chad Ruppert, and Mike on finding an answer for this so I will now how to handle this in my office once the time comes.

Also would like to bring to the boards attention that these wind and solar projects on leased land will need to be surveyed and then split by our GIS and assigned new parcel numbers per legislation. With this my concern is how it affects the current leases on file since there will be new PINs and new legal descriptions. Will new leases with the new legal and new PIN need to be recorded?

New Projects:

- Crosscheck of records in PIN generation software against property parcel records to locate improperly recorded/notated PINS.
- Retirement of nearly all of Deer Creek Condominiums parcels and lots by request of new owner

Ongoing Projects:

- Created GIS data layer and map of warning sirens across the county to help establish gaps, overlaps, and sirens in need of repair, using ArcPro for the extra practice. I can't even begin to convey how much easier it is to build new data in this program now that I'm starting to learn where ESRI moved my most-often-used tools. It's like cooking in a professional chef's kitchen instead of your home kitchen: excellent equipment, except you have to find where they put the basil...
- Solar/wind project inventory and mapping updated with new projects.

Completed:

- First series of ArcPro training workshops completed. Next will be in May.

On the Back Burner:

- Continuing search for annexation/municipal boundary verification documents across the county. I currently can only fully verify the borders of Waggoner, Ohlman, and Coalton. Ideally, I would like to have fully verified borders of all the municipalities in Montgomery County.
- Crosscheck of revised Land Use data against existing records.

Concerns:

As always, mapwork continues apace.
