Montgomery County Government

Montgomery County was established by in 1821. The purpose of County government is to fulfill statutory requirements of county government in accordance with state and federal law and the Illinois Constitution. The county's elected governing body is the county board, which is composed of seven districts of two members each. The county board, along with elected and appointed county officers, provides a variety of services authorized under Illinois law for the public safety and convenience including law enforcement, emergency services, the criminal and civil court systems, public health, real estate tax assessment and collection, election administration, land records, local highway systems, vital records maintenance, and licensure and regulatory authority. The county government operates five primary sites, the locations of which are posted below. The county employs approximately 145 full-time and 17 part-time employees and for fiscal year 2022 has appropriated an operating budget of \$36,584,901.00. The diagram below sets forth the functional subdivisions of the county government.
